

## **I. COURSE ACTIVITIES**

#### 1. Student READY- RAWE Programme ASA 2021 Batch

#### a. Orientation Programme

With blessings of Beloved Chancellor Amma, the Student READY - Rural Agricultural Work Experience (RAWE) program commenced on 6<sup>th</sup> November 2024 for 2021 batch students. The RAWE orientation programme began with a prayer song by Navya S Nair (2021 Batch), followed by the lighting of the lamp by ASA Dean, Dr. Sudheesh Manalil, Dr. Sivaraj P, Dr. Sathyapriya E and student representatives. Dr. Sudheesh Manalil, Dean, gave insightful explanations of the RAWE principles in his introductory remarks. The RAWE Coordinator, Dr. Sivaraj P, gave an overview of the RAWE program. Later, Dr. E. Sathyapriya, Class Committee Chairperson (VII Semester), gave a briefing on the RAWE course details and its various activities.





#### b. Village Attachment and Plant Clinic

A week of on-campus training from various faculties was scheduled as part of the RAWE & AIA program Phase I (Village attachment and Plant clinic). The on-campus training included sessions on various topics such as General Orientation, Agronomy and Soil Science, Plant Pathology and Microbiology, Horticulture and Food Processing, Animal Production, Biotechnology, Crop Physiology, Agricultural Entomology, Plant Breeding and Seed Technology, Agricultural Extension, Agricultural Economics, and Remote Sensing. These sessions were led by ASA faculty members, who shared their extensive knowledge and provided hands-on experience to the students. They equipped the students with all the necessities for a successful village attachment and plant clinic, afterwards, students were attached to their allotted village panchayaths from 13th November 2024 onwards

#### 2. Ecotourism visit to Silent Valley National Park

On November 20, 2024, the 2023 batch students visited Silent Valley National Park in Mukkali, Palakkad. The visit was part of their course 19ENV201 - Environmental Science and Disaster Management, where they explored the ecology of plants and animals, along with role of abiotic factors on availability of water, temperature fluctuations, and other environmental elements. Students were taken deep inside the National Park through vehicles, and they observed the different floral species like orchids, rhododendrons, a 400-year-old wild jack fruit tree, and several indigenous species. Similarly, they witnessed some of the faunal species like long-tailed macaques, flying squirrels, deer, etc. inside the national park. Additionally, the students learned the history of Silent Valley and its movement to conserve the National Park, and the climatic conditions inside the park throughout the year.

The visit was organized and accompanied by Dr. Jidhu Vaishnavi S, Assistant Professor (Crop Physiology), and Dr. Sivasabari K, Assistant Professor (Soil Science and Agricultural Chemistry).




#### 3. Field Visit to ARS, Bhavanisagar

On November 26, 2024, ASA 2022 batch students visited the Agriculture Research Station, TNAU, Bhavanisagar. The visit was jointly organized as part of course 19GPB301 Crop Improvement -I (Kharif crops), 19PAT301 Diseases of Field and horticultural Crops and Their Management Crops – I, and 19AGR301 Practical Crop Production -I (Kharif Crops) during their V semester and it helped them to learn about different aspects of Kharif crops. Dr. Sathish, Entomologist, Agriculture Research Station (ARS), explained the ongoing research activities of this research station. The stages of seed production and evaluation of new crop varieties and hybrids in rice and pulses were explained in a detailed manner. Students gained knowledge on various pests and disease surveillance and recommendations on various crops grown in this station. This visit was organized and accompanied by the course teachers Dr. Dhivyapriya D, (Genetics and Plant Breeding), Dr. S.Parthasarathy (Plant Pathology), Dr. V.Marthandan (Seed Science and Technology), and Dr. Sureshkumar R. (Agronomy).



#### 4. Educational visit to Ooty

An educational visit to Ooty was organized for the first-year students (2024 batch) on 26<sup>th</sup> December 2024. The visit was conducted as part of the courses; 24BIC101 Fundamentals of Plant Biochemistry and Biotechnology and 24HOR101 Fundamentals of Horticulture. Dr. Reena S, Assistant Professor (SG) Biotechnology, and Dr. Kumaresan S, Assistant Professor (Horticulture) coordinated the educational visit to Ooty. Students visited Central Potato Research Institute, where Mrs. Divya K. Lekshmanan, Scientist (CPRI), explained about various activities conducted at the station such as varietal development programs, and micropropagation of virus-free plants. Students visited potato fields and observed the nematode infestation occurring in potatoes. Further, they visited the tissue culture facility available on the campus and the hardening area. They observed different stages of micropropagation in potatoes. Students also visited the nursery and botanical garden at Ooty to explore various horticultural crops. Students were explained about plant propagation of different horticultural crops.




