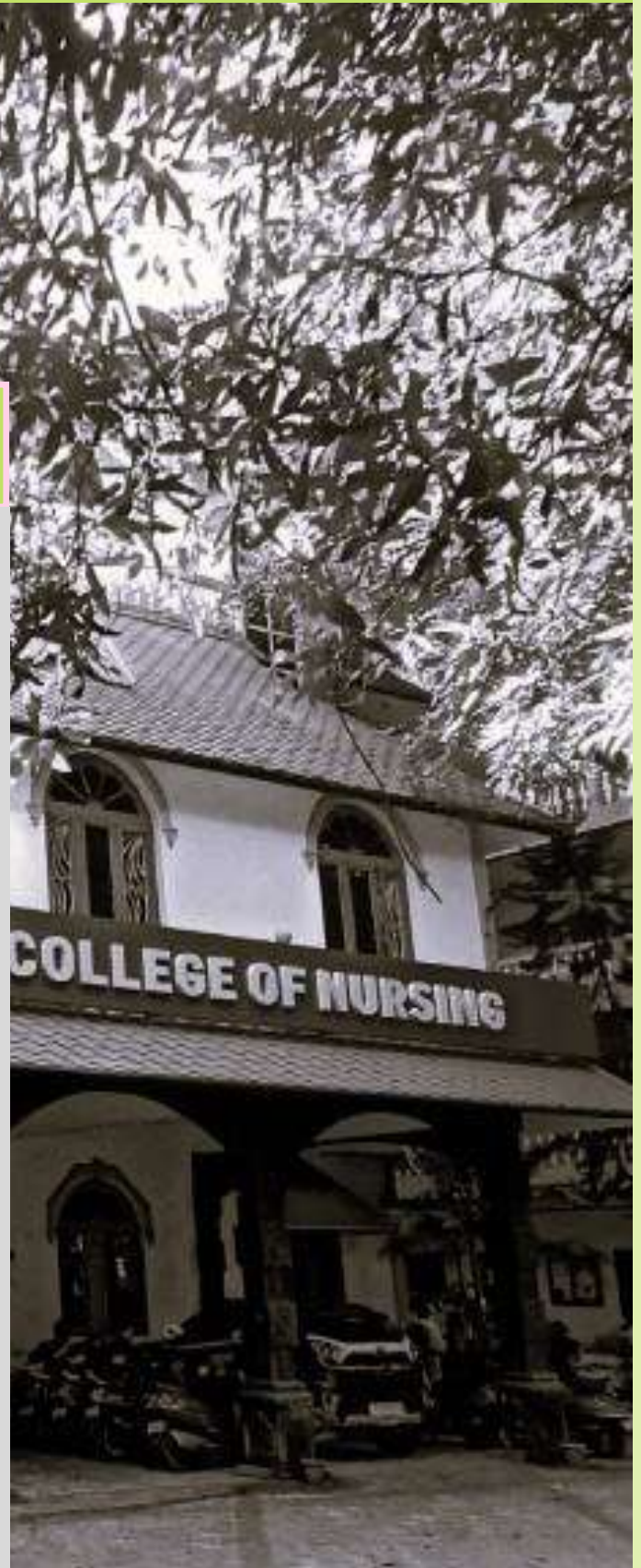

ANTI-RAGGING WEEK OBSERVATION

Amrita College of Nursing conducted an anti-ragging week observation from 12th to 29th of August 2025 in accordance with the guidelines of the University Grants Commission (UGC) and Indian Nursing Council (INC). The following sessions were conducted.

Session on Legal Aspects of Ragging and consequences for students

Session I

An awareness session on Anti-Ragging was organized for third and fifth semester B.Sc Nursing students on 12/08/2025. The resource person was Mr. Manoj, Sub Inspector, Cheranalloor Police Station. He emphasizes the dangers of ragging and the importance of maintaining a respectful campus environment. 200 students attended the session. This was followed by and documentary videos presentation from the UGC.



ANTI-RAGGING WEEK OBSERVATION

Session II

An awareness session on Anti-Ragging was conducted for First Semester B. Sc. Nursing students on 21.08.2025. 97 students and few faculty members attended the session . Mr. Paulose Kuttampuzha, Rtd Sub Inspector of Police gave a talk on “A cruelty against humanity”. He explained what is ragging, its reasons, types, history, laws and UGC regulations in India, consequences of ragging, and its preventive measures. Also he emphasize on how to report ragging. Followed which videos and documentaries



Session III

The third awareness session on Legal Aspects of Ragging and Consequences was conducted for Sixth Semester B. Sc Nursing Students on 23.08.25 from 11am to 12 noon. The session was taken by Ms. Siby T Das, SI Cyber Cell, Kochi. The resource person emphasized that ragging is not a trivial act of fun but a punishable criminal offense that can lead to imprisonment, fines, suspension, or even expulsion from the institution. Real-life case examples were shared to illustrate how ragging incidents can ruin academic careers and personal lives. Students were also informed about the mechanisms available for lodging complaints, including the Anti-Ragging Helpline and institutional grievance redressed systems.

Faculty Development Program on Anti ragging Awareness

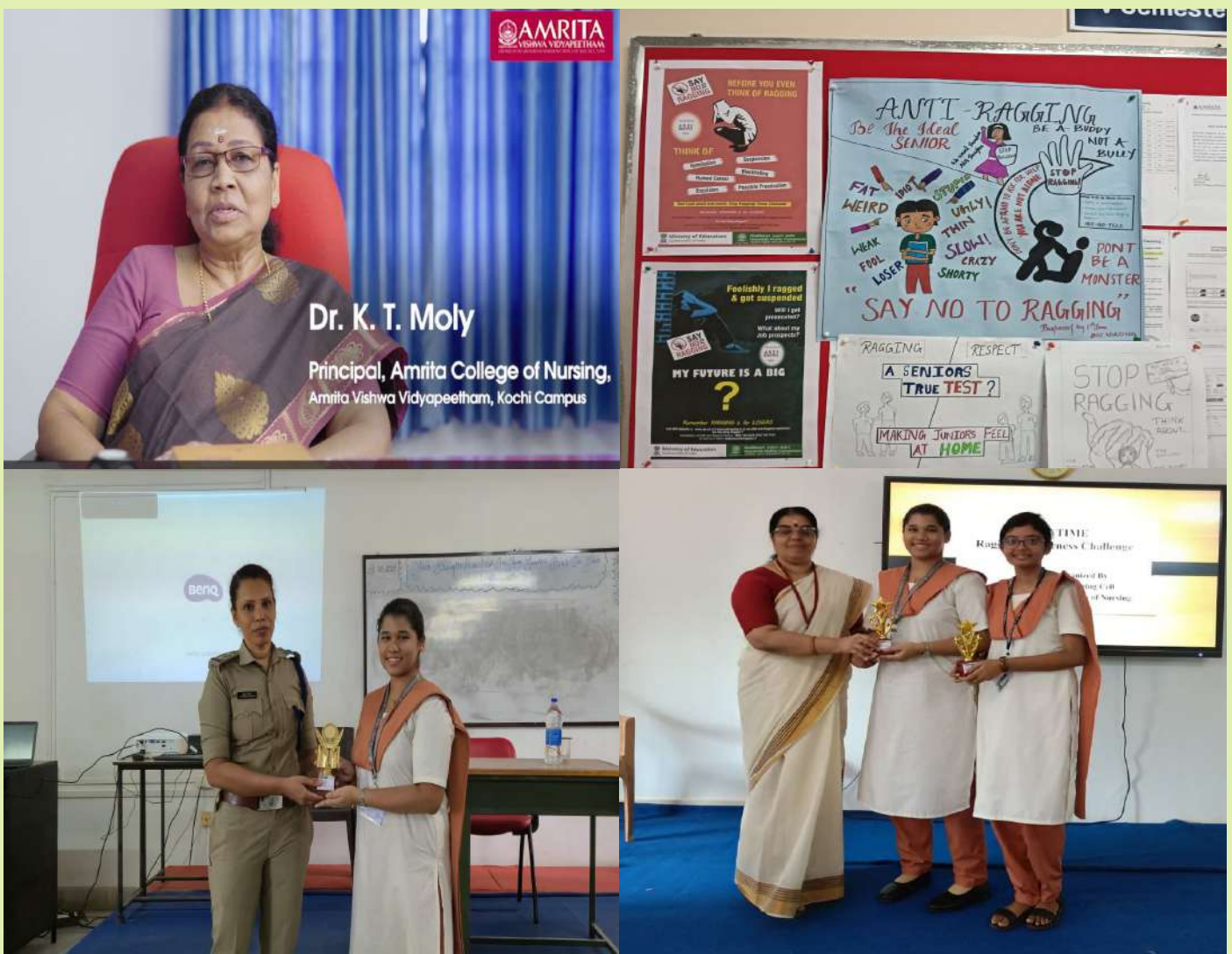
A webinar on **Safe campus, Happy Campus: Faculty's Role** was conducted on 25.08.2025 at 12 noon. The resource person was Adv. Aswin, Assistant Professor, NMIMS, Mumbai. He emphasized the role of faculty in sensitizing the students against ragging. The speaker explained that faculty members act not only as educators but also as mentors and guardians for students. Their timely intervention in addressing early signs of ragging, harassment, or student distress can prevent serious incidents. The legal framework on ragging, including UGC Regulations and relevant IPC provisions, was also discussed to sensitize faculty to their responsibilities in reporting and preventing such acts.



ANTI-RAGGING WEEK OBSERVATION

Display of Videos and Documentaries on Ragging to Students

As part of the Anti-Ragging Awareness initiatives, videos and documentaries produced by UGC on ragging were displayed for all the students. The objective of the program was to sensitize students about the seriousness of ragging, its psychological and legal consequences, and the need to maintain a safe and inclusive campus environment. Quiz and essay writing competitions were also held for students and prizes were distributed to the winners. A video message on Anti-Ragging was delivered by the Principal, Dr. K. T. Moly, to create awareness among students about the ill effects of ragging and the importance of maintaining a safe campus. In her message, she emphasized that ragging in any form is strictly prohibited and punishable under UGC regulations, and the institution follows a zero-tolerance policy towards such activities.



INDUCTION PROGRAMME WORKSHOP (VISTARA-2025)

A two-day induction programme workshop, VISTARA-2025, was organized at Amrita College of Nursing. 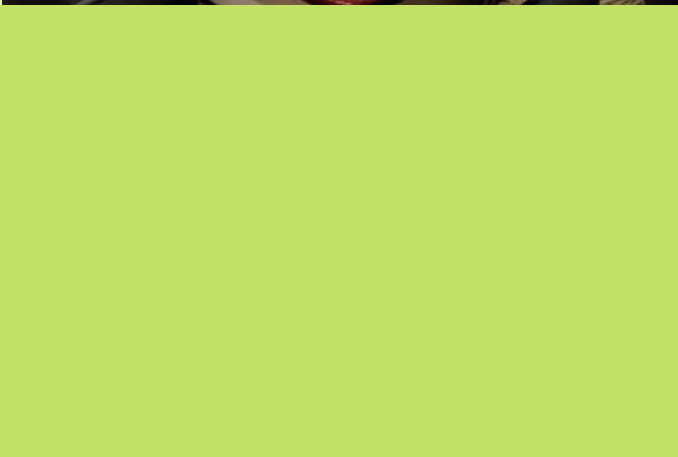
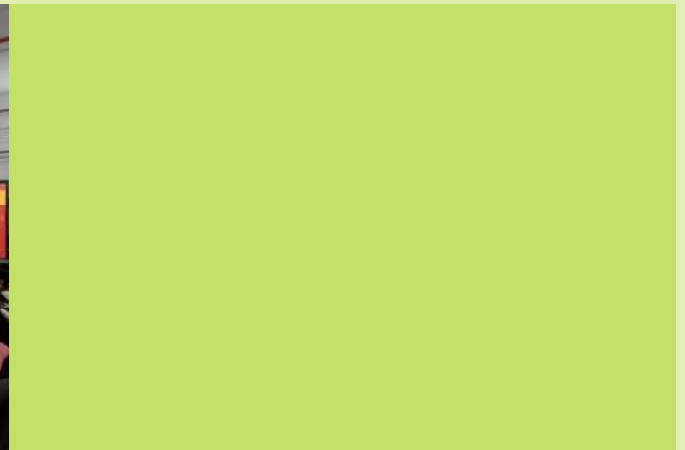


CYBER SECURITY AWARENESS WEEK

Cyber Security Awareness Week was observed from November 1–5, 2025. The program aligned with the national initiative to promote cyber hygiene and responsible digital practices. A Cyber Security Drill was conducted with 117 students participating. Students enacted cyberbullying and cyberstalking scenarios followed by a quiz on safe online practices, promoting practical learning and active engagement.

A Faculty Development Program facilitated by Ms. Vinothini Sekar focused on cybercrime trends, user mistakes, and preventive strategies. Faculty learned about phishing, identity theft, OTP fraud, and legal provisions under the IT Act. The session concluded with a quiz and interactive discussion.

The Cyber Security Awareness Week concluded with a series of creative and intellectually engaging competitions designed for both students and faculty members. A total of 25 enthusiastic participants took part in the competitions. These activities aimed to reinforce key concepts of cyber safety while providing a platform for participants to showcase their artistic talents, critical thinking, and written communication skills.



INNOVATION ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT CENTRE

Session on Fare - A Spark of Inspiration

A session was conducted on 18th December at 3.30 pm by **IEDC** Centre Amrita College of Nursing to promote innovation, entrepreneurship, and self-employment awareness among nursing students. The programme was organised to motivate students to explore entrepreneurial opportunities alongside their professional careers and to develop confidence in transforming creative ideas into viable business ventures. A total of 15 students attended the session. The session was led by Ms Krishnapriya P, a 7th-semester student of Amrita College of Nursing, who is a budding entrepreneur. She manages her own Instagram business page that focuses on hampers and customised gift services. She began the session by sharing her personal entrepreneurial journey, explaining how she initiated her business, managed academic responsibilities along with entrepreneurship, and overcame challenges during the initial stages of business development. She explained the scope of entrepreneurship in the present market scenario and emphasised the importance of creativity, innovation, consistency, and customer satisfaction in building and sustaining a successful business. She shared her experience of the entrepreneurship journey. A significant part of the session was dedicated to explaining MSME registration. The resource person elaborated on the importance of MSME registration, eligibility criteria, step-by-step registration procedure, and the benefits offered by the government to registered enterprises, including financial assistance, subsidies, and access to loans. This information helped students gain clarity about the formal and legal aspects of starting a business.



STATE LEVEL WORKSHOP ON INNOVATIONS IN RESEARCH DISSEMINATION

The State Level Workshop on “Innovations in Research Dissemination” was held on 21st and 22nd November 2025 at Amrita College of Nursing. The program aimed to equip faculty, research scholars, and healthcare professionals with modern techniques for effective dissemination of research findings. The two days sessions focused on digital tools, artificial intelligence (AI), publication processes, trusted research environments, and visual scientific communication. Prof. (Dr.) K. T. Moly introduced the fundamentals of research dissemination and emphasized its relevance in strengthening evidence-based practice. Mr. Arnab Chowdhury from Wolters Kluwer delivered an online session on journal selection, publication processes, and evidence-based digital resources. The session by Mr. Biphi C. Chacko demonstrated the Trusted Research Environment (TRE) and the Amrita Health Information System. Participants gained direct hands-on experience during the session. Dr. Manu Raj then discussed “Inside the Editorial Mind,” elaborating on what top journals expect, frequent causes of rejection, and practical tips for improving publication success.

Day 2 Dr. Rahul Venugopal presented an engaging session on digital storytelling for research, explaining how AI tools, blogs, and social media significantly simplify global visibility of research. participants found this session particularly inspiring and relevant.

This was followed by a session on systematic reviews by Dr. R. Venkitachalam, who discussed methodologies and the importance of synthesizing evidence for clinical decision-making.

Post-lunch, Dr. Rahul Venugopal conducted a session on visual and multimedia communication, demonstrating AI tools that assist in developing high-quality scientific visuals.

The final session of the workshop was handled by Dr. Bijo Mathew, who shared insights on classical journal publication strategies and effective communication of research findings.
